Make Fuel Fair

Apallingly, over 25,000 people each year die because of fuel poverty. The Government could have introduced a law which would have dramatically improved the lives of a staggering 3 million older people in the UK who can't afford to keep their homes warm.

But the Private Members Bill to end fuel poverty did not make it through its second reading in Parliament. It received 89 Votes in favour of the Bill and two against, but needed 100 votes to get through. Mervyn Kohler, Special advisor to Age Concern and Help the Aged, said: 'Fuel Poverty' is a very important issue and we need to keep the pressure on the Government to tackle it.

Coventry Pensioners Convention has already sent a petition to the Government and written to our MP's urging them to sign the EDM.

We have had replies from all three Coventry MP's enclosing a reply from the Energy Minister Mike O'Brien QC MP which was far from satisfactory and in the main did not really say anything other than rhetoric.

National Day of Action

On the 3rd April Coventry Pensioners Convention took a stall on Coventry Retail Market to campaign for a better State Pension. We were asking for the State Pension to be raised to £165 per week which is the Governments Official Poverty figure. We gained more than 600 signatures for our petition and gained 20 new members. Thanks must go to all of the people who came to the Market and supported us. The Management of Coventry Retail Market and to all those who gave up their time to come and man the stall.

NHS Consultation in Coventry

We are currently involved in a number of meetings through Voluntary Action Coventry in Consultation with the NHS. There has also recently been the set up of 'Coventry Involvement Network of LINK.' LINKs are new independent body created by government legislation to give local people a greater say about local health and social care services. Coventry LINK is a network of individuals and groups. It works to improve the health and social care provision for all those living within its area by:

- Listening to what people have to say about health and social care;
- Investigating the issues raised by local people;
- Reporting its findings to the appropriate organisations and to the local community.
- Acting to ensure reports and recommendations are taken into consideration by health and local care

Pensioners Parliament 2009 2 - 4 June 2009

Members from Coventry attended the Blackpool Parliament and took part in the March from the North Pier to the Winter Gardens led by the Wingates Band from near Blackburn. There was a good turnout. We found that this was the best rally that there had been for some years. Rosie Winterton the Pensions Minister, Nigel Watson the Shadow Pensions Minister, Paul Rowan from the Liberal Democrats and Joe Harris from the National Pensioners Convention the spoke on the first day. On the second day there were sessions which explored the need for dignity in care of older people, the campaign for age equality, the role of LINKS in the NHS, how we can defend local services from threat, the impact of the economic crisis on Pensioners and the launch of a Pensioners' Manifesto for the next election. A panel answered questions about things which affect us all, asking for Pensions to be Indexed Linked and no more means testing. On the last day we attended two more meetings. Michael Parkinson also gave a moving speech. The day was finished off with an evening of music. Everyone felt that they had had a lovely time and are looking forward to next years Parliament.
